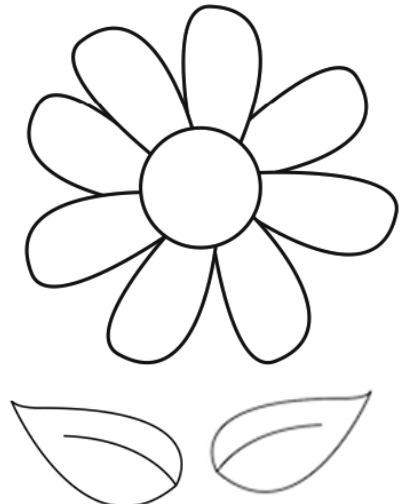

26. Paper Roll Flowers.

- o You will need a paper roll (from toilet paper, paper towels, etc.); paint, crayons or markers; glue and scissors.
- o Paint or color your paper roll flower stem.
- o Cut or trace the flower/leaves on an old greeting card or heavy paper from junk mail.
- o Better yet, why not draw your own flower/leaves in a similar size to the templates below. Paint/color the flower/leaves as you like and embellish as you wish.
- o Can you think of any other recycle items you can use for the leaves or flower? Glue leaves to the stem.
- o When your flower is ready, cut about a 1/2" slit on two opposite sides of the top of the stem. Insert your flower into the slits on the roll stem.

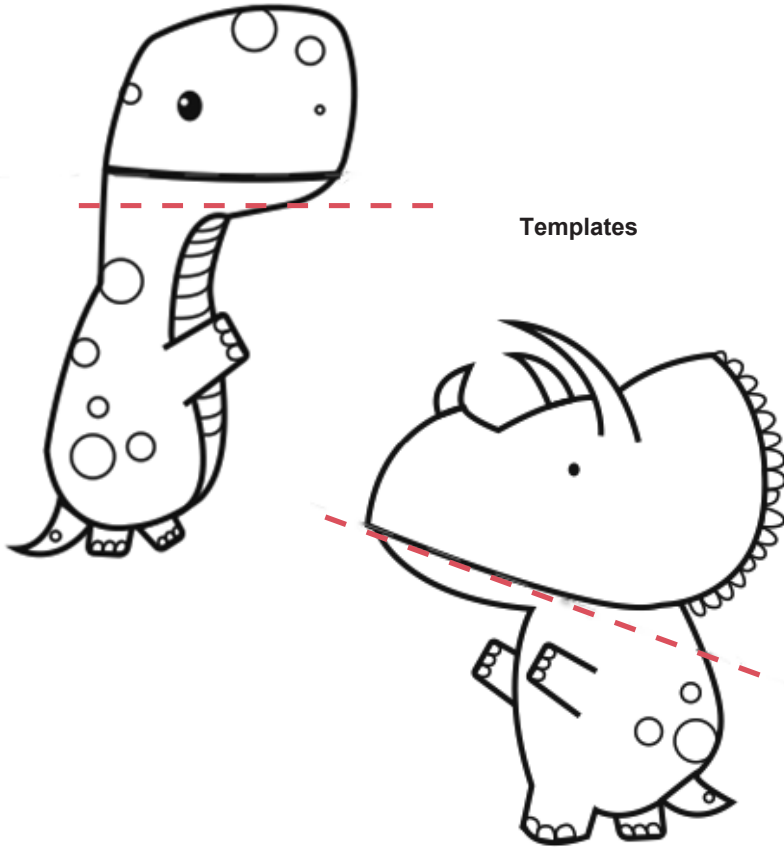

Simple Machine: Dinosaur

- o You will need a pinch clothespin, scissors, markers or crayons and glue/glue stick.
- o Trace, print or copy the dinosaur templates below. Color your dinosaur and cut along the dotted line. Glue the top and bottom of your dinosaur to the sides of the clothespin. (see Class 5 fish illustration for clothespin position.)
- o Make 2 dinosaurs (One from each or two the same)



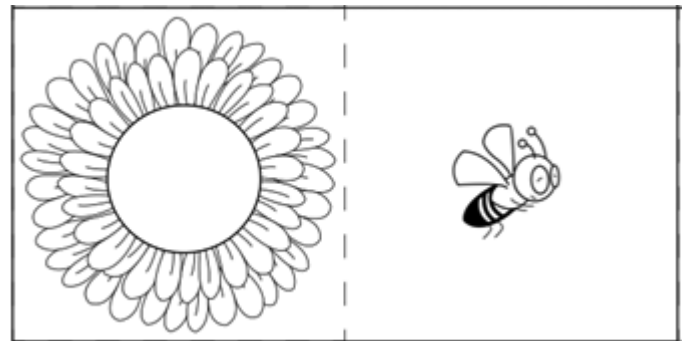

Visual Science – Optical Illusion: Bee on a Flower

- o You will need scissors, markers, crayons or color pencils, glue and a toothpick/pencil/chopstick/dowel or straw.
- o Copy or print the template below.
- o Color the bee and flower. Don't color the center of the flower too dark.
- o Cut out along the solid line.
- o Fold on the dotted line and glue the halves together with your stick in between.
- o When dry, Spin the stick between your fingers quickly and the bee will appear to be on the flower!

- o You will need a pinch clothespin, scissors, markers or crayons and glue/glue stick.
- o Trace or copy the fish template above.
- o Color your fish and cut along the dotted line.
- o Glue the top and bottom of your fish to the sides of the clothespin.
- o A group of fish is called a school. Your school should include at least two fish.



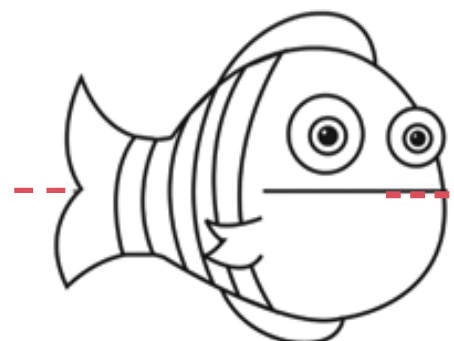
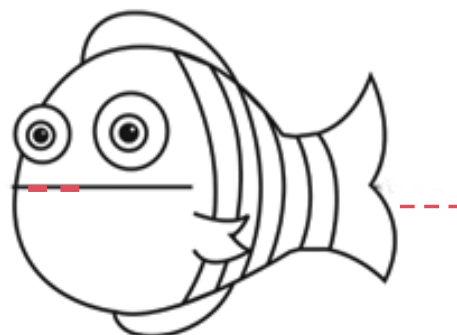
Class No. 3

- o From one side of the egg carton you will need to cut one section for the head **PLUS** one section for each year of your age.
- o For example, if you are two years old your caterpillar will be three sections long.
- o Decorate and embellish as you wish, then write the numbers on the sections – one for each year of your age.

- o Use different colors to create a group of six friendly monsters!

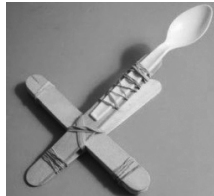

Physics: Mini Marshmallow Catapult

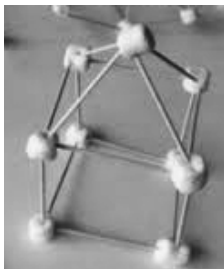
- o You will need 7 popsicle sticks, rubber bands and a plastic spoon.
- o Use the rubber bands, on each end, to secure 5 sticks together.
- o Slide another stick horizontally into the bundle, one stick up from the bottom of the stack.
- o Secure the spoon to the remaining stick with rubber bands and then place it horizontally on top of the stack.
- o Attach the upper and lower horizontal sticks with another rubber band.
(see illustration below or check in the library or online for ideas)
- o We will provide mini marshmallows
- o for testing.

Engineering : Build a Tower.

- o You will need toothpicks and mini marshmallows.

- o Size limit 12"x12"x12"

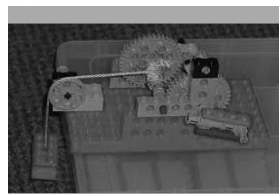

- o You can also pull out your favorite old construction kit pieces and build your own.
- o Entries must be fixed to a base no larger than 12"x12"x12".
- o Visit your local library or search online for ideas and inspiration.



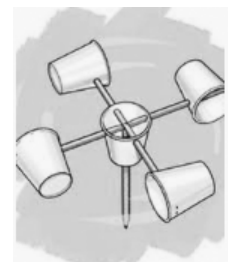

Weather Science: It's Windy Out There! Make an Anemometer

An anemometer is an instrument that measures wind speed. It is usually made with small cups attached to a vertical shaft. Wind causes the cups and shaft to turn, the speed of turning can be used to calculate wind speed. Ten turns per minute means the wind speed is about 1 mile per hour.

For more information visit your local library or search online for more details.

- o To make your anemometer you will need:
 - Five small (3 ounce) paper cups
 - One sharpened pencil with an eraser
 - Hole punch
 - Two straws
 - One push pin
- o Punch four holes in one of the cups, across from each other near the top.
- o Thread the two straws through these holes to form a cross.
- o Use the pencil to gently poke a hole in the bottom center of this cup.
- o With the remaining four cups punch two holes, about an inch apart, halfway down the cup. Thread each cup through one end of each straw. Be sure all cups are facing the same direction.
- o Insert the pencil, eraser up, through the bottom of the center cup.
- o When it is touching the straws, use the push pin to gently go through the straws, where they cross, and into the pencil eraser. Don't push the pin too far into the eraser or the cups won't spin.
- o You can use a fan to test your anemometer.
- o Adjust as needed.
