RULES - Entries Close Friday, August 20st

Before making entries, read Rules and Regulations, Dept. of Agriculture and Markets, Part 350 in the Premium Book.

1. All exhibitors must live in Dutchess County or adjacent counties, Columbia, Ulster, Orange, Putnam ONLY. (NYState only)
2. **An exhibitor may make only one entry in each class. On Sunday, August 23rd, in the event you do not have an entry for which you registered and paid for, you may SUBSTITUTE with another class(es). NO ADDITIONS CAN BE MADE. NO REFUNDS.**
3. All vegetables will be judged for freedom from disease and blemish, uniformity and market/table quality Collections will be judged for creativity and eye-appeal, as well as vegetable quality. Pumpkins, winter squash and watermelons will also be judged for size.
4. **Exhibits must be brought to the Horticulture Building (upstairs) between 6 P.M. and 9 P.M. on Sunday, August 22rd. Exhibits must be in place by 9:30 P.M. For every \$10.00 spent in entry fees, the exhibitor will receive one free admission ticket.**
5. Premiums will not be awarded if exhibit is judged unworthy, although there may be no competition.
6. No waxes or polishes may be used to enhance any vegetable's appearance.
7. The Chairmen reserve the right to remove any decaying entries during the course of the Fair to keep up the appearance of display.
8. All vegetables must be entered on a separate general form. (i.e., entry forms with photography and vegetables on the same form will not be accepted).
9. The Fair will not be responsible for any exhibits or equipment damaged or lost. **Exhibits must be picked up on Sunday, August 29th at 9:00 p.m. Exhibitors will not be able to drive their vehicles to the tent for pick up; Prize ribbons will not be mailed.**

Exhibitors are requested to write the name of the variety of ENTRIES on the entry tags WHEN DISPLAYING THEIR VEGETABLES. This is to aid in judging as well as to be able to answer questions from fairgoers during the fair. Your participation is appreciated.

Vegetables

1. Beets, Table, 5 specimens, top trimmed to approx. 1 inch
2. String beans, 1 quart.
3. Broccoli, 1 head or equivalent bunch, in water
4. Brussel Sprouts, 1 stalk with no less than 8 specimens
5. Cabbage, Green, 1 head, untrimmed
6. Cabbage, Red, 1 head, untrimmed
7. Cabbage, Savoy, 1 head, untrimmed
8. Carrots, 5 specimens, tops trimmed to approx. 1 inch
9. Cauliflower, 1 head, untrimmed
10. Celery, 1 plant, potted or in water
11. Swiss Chard, any variety, 1 plant, potted or in water
12. Cucumbers, Pickling, 5 specimens
13. Cucumbers, Slicing, 5 specimens
14. Eggplant, Asian Type, 1 specimen
15. Eggplant, any other color, 1 specimen
16. Garlic, 3 specimens, air-dried, roots removed, tops trimmed. **NO decorations added**
17. Greens, any variety **except kale**, such as collards, mustard, spinach, etc., 1 plant or equivalent bunch, potted or in water
18. Greens, kale, any variety, 1 plant or equivalent bunch, potted or in water
19. Herbs, **any herb except basil or parsley**, 1 plant or bunch of not less than 15 stems, potted or in water
20. Herb, Basil, 1 plant or bunch of not less than 15 stems, potted or in water
21. Herb, Parsley, 1 plant or bunch of not less than 15 stems, potted or in water
22. Leek, 5 specimens, roots trimmed to approx 1 inch, tops trimmed to approx. 6 inch.
23. Melon, Muskmelon or Cantaloupe, any variety, 1 specimen
24. Melon, Watermelon, any variety, 1 specimen
25. Melon, any other type not listed, 1 specimen, **variety must be named**
26. Okra, 5 specimens
27. Onions, Red, 5 specimens, air-dried, unpeeled, roots removed
28. Onions, Yellow, 5 specimens, air-dried, unpeeled, roots removed
29. Onions, Scallions, Green Onions, or Bunching Onions, 1 plant or equivalent bunch of not less than 8 specimens, tops untrimmed in water.
30. Ornamental Vegetables, 3 specimens, may be all same or 3 different types
31. Peppers, any Sweet Green variety, 5 specimens
32. Peppers, any Sweet Purple, Black, or Brown colored variety, 5 specimens
33. Peppers, any Sweet Red variety, 5 specimens
34. Peppers, any Sweet Yellow, Orange, White, or Cream colored variety, 5 specimens
35. Peppers, Sweet Italian frying type, 5 specimens
36. Peppers, Poblano, 5 specimens
37. Peppers, Jalapeno, 5 specimens
38. Peppers, any Long Hot variety, 5 specimens
39. Peppers, any Short or Round Hot variety **except Jalapeno**, 5 specimens
40. Potatoes, any Fingerling variety, 5 specimens
41. Potatoes, Katahdin, 5 specimens
42. Potatoes, Kennebec, 5 specimens
43. Potatoes, any Yellow variety such as Yukon Gold, 5 specimens
44. Potatoes, any Blue or Purple skin or flesh variety, 5 specimens

47. Potatoes, any other White skin variety not listed, 5 specimens

51. Rhubarb, 5 stalks **pulled from plant, leaves cut to approx. 3 inch above stalks**
52. Shallots, 5 specimens, air dried, unpeeled, roots removed, tops trimmed
53. Squash, Hubbard, any color, 1 specimen
54. Squash, Acorn, 2 specimens
55. Squash, Butternut, 2 specimens
56. Squash. Buttercup, Ambercup, or any kubochoa type, 1 specimens
57. Squash, Delicata, 2 specimen
58. Squash, Spaghetti, 2 specimen
59. Squash, any Winter variety not listed, 2 specimens, variety must be named
60. Squash, Summer Yellow Straightneck or Crookneck, 2 specimens under 10 inches
61. Squash, Zucchini, any Green, Yellow, Striped, or Round variety, 2 specimens under 10in
62. Squash, any Summer variety not listed, 2 specimens **variety must be named**
63. Sweet Corn, any yellow, white or bi-color variety, 5 specimens, husked to expose 1/2 of surface of each
64. Tomatoes, any heriloom variety, 5 specimens of the same variety, stems removed, variety must be named
65. Tomatoes, red, 5 specimens, stems removed
66. Tomatoes, yellow, 5 specimens, stems removed
67. Tomatoes, paste type, 5 specimens, stems removed
68. Tomatoes, small fruited red; any cherry, grape or pearl type, 10 specimens, stems removed
69. Tomatoes, small fruited yellow; any cherry, grape or pear type, 10 specimens, stems removed
70. Any other vegetables not listed, 3 specimens, or equivalent, variety must be named
